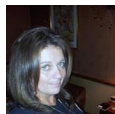

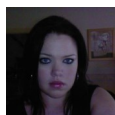

DO MALE CARERS GET ENOUGH OF THE RIGHT SUPPORT?

A Dads Story – “Where has my confidence gone, I often find myself asking!”

Being a father and a full time carer for your disabled child, should make you feel important, empowered and in control. Unfortunately in my experience, this is far from how I feel and in reality, I feel lonely, isolated and worthless. Society, seems to be so far behind when it comes to my own experience. In the years that I have been in a caring role, I have only ever met two other male carers. Why is this?

I know through research alone that nearly half of all carers are male, so where is everybody hiding? Support networks, professional and socially seem to be so well tailored for mums and female carers. Over the years I have been to many support groups and get together groups, but I am always only the male person there. Don't get me wrong, I have received some amazing advice, support and reassurance. I have met some amazing mums. However, I do feel that some of my needs as a male are different to those of a female.

This is why Blessing in Disguise with help from myself want to raise awareness of how men may feel as a carer. We are hoping to raise more support for men so that the male carers within the community can find support and help when and where needed.

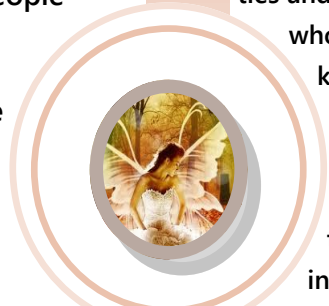

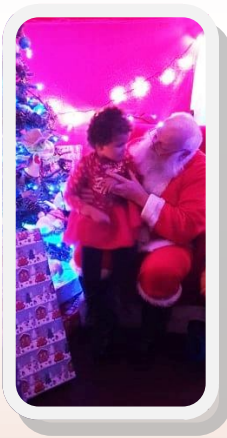

What we do...

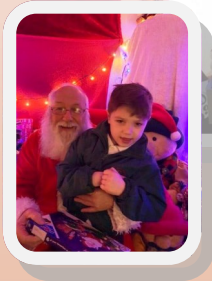
We fundraise all year round to provide much needed support to children & young people, their families/carers by:
