Every so often we receive messages about the children and young people we work with and their incredible achievements. Last week we heard about Chloe and Amber's story and we were absolutely blown away by how brave and courageous these two little girls are.

Chloe and Amber are twin sisters who both have additional needs. In July this year the girls, their mum and grandma were at Delamere forest when very suddenly their grandma had a stroke. There was no phone signal in the area in which they were located so Chloe was asked to stay with her grandma whilst their mum ran for help with Amber. Chloe did exactly that, she was incredibly brave and helpful whilst she stayed with her grandma. Whilst the family waited for the ambulance to arrive both girls were very calm and waited patiently for help to arrive. To quote the girls mum the girls showed "great maturity during a very distressing and unpredictable situation". Thankfully the girl's grandma is now on the mend and back home.

We are a socially responsible organisation, providing much needed support to many children, young adults & their families / carers by providing, free of charge, a range of life enhancing equipment, activities and social/ recreational opportunities for the whole family. Through

personal experience, we know that it can often be difficult on other family members, who perhaps unfortunately miss out, but we will endeavour to encourage them to achieve positive changes. With the right funding we have the potential to increase the number of vulnerable people that we support each year, providing much needed equipment to more families across the UK and making a significant difference.
